Campus MovieFest, College Battle of the Bands, and The Elfenworks Foundation Announce 2011 Finalists for the Elfenworks Social Justice Category

Recognizing Finalists at the International Grand Finale; Winner Earns \$10,000 Cash Grant

Hollywood, CA, June 7, 2011- [Campus MovieFest](#) (CMF), the world's largest student film festival, in partnership with the [Elfenworks Foundation](#) (TEF), are pleased to announce the top finalists for the Elfenworks Social Justice Category. All finalists will screen their films at CMF's [International Grand Finale](#) (IGF) in Hollywood from June 23-26, and one winning student team will walk away with a \$10,000 cash grant, with additional grants awarded to other finalists.

Over the last four years, CMF and The Elfenworks Foundation have invited students from across the country to create short films and music to submit content to a special category relating to mounting domestic issues, with winners earning cash grants to continue making positive contributions in the world.

This year's filmmakers and musicians were encouraged to look at how fear or hope might be contributing to poverty and/or inequality. Musician finalists will be recognized at the College Battle of the Bands Finale at The Echo on Friday, June 24, and filmmaker finalists will be honored at the Campus MovieFest International Grand Finale red carpet awards ceremony on Saturday, June 25, at the Steven J. Ross Theater on the Warner Bros studios lot.

"While we love seeing all the creative funny and dramatic content our students produce, we're always especially thrilled to see our students creating content that can fight social injustice," said David Roemer, Co-founder of Campus MovieFest. "We're honored to work with the Elfenworks Foundation on this vital cause, and grateful for their support and vision to empower the next generation of filmmakers and musicians."

Out of hundreds of impressive entries, The Elfenworks Foundation selected the following films as this year's finalists:

- [Blind Eye](#) – **University of South Florida** – A young man learns to take action against injustices.
- [100 Strong](#) – **San Diego State University** - Random acts of neighborhood violence spark community residents to take action.
- [Take the Hit](#) – **University of California, Berkeley** – An intimate look at the serious realities of verbal abuse.
- [The Busker](#) – **Rutgers University** – Drawing upon the socioeconomic stigma of poverty by showing that humanity pervades wealth.
